2. State of Iowa’s DLM Assessment Requirements & Timelines

The grade-level EEs required for assessment are listed in tables beginning on page 4. Teachers are required to teach and assess the required EEs during each assessment window (see table 1). Best practice is to assess each EE after instruction has taken place instead of assessing all required EEs at the end of the window. This practice embeds assessments within instruction and allows teachers to use assessment data to inform instruction and provides the student the opportunity to be reassessed within the reporting window.

Any student not assessed on all the required EEs within each assessment window will be considered an exclusion unless granted exception by the Iowa Department of Education. Individual Education Plan (IEP) teams must request this exception yearly before the end of the Spring Assessment Window from the Iowa Department of Education by contacting jennifer.denne@iowa.gov.

In this document, the term “blueprint” refers to the Essential Elements (EEs) required to be tested and covered within each conceptual area of the DLM Alternate Assessment. Each EE must be tested a minimum of one time during the Fall and Spring Assessment Windows. Each Assessment Window is broken into two phases: Fall Phase 1, Fall Phase 2, Spring Phase 1 and Spring Phase 2.

During the instructionally embedded Fall and Spring Assessment Windows, teachers are required to:

- Use the State of Iowa's DLM ELA Individual Student Test Blueprint document to identify EEs required at each grade level
- Record these EEs within the Instruction and Assessment Planner as instructional plans
- Choose which EEs to assess during each phase of the assessment windows
- Assign testlets in the Instruction and Assessment Planner
- Access the TIPs page for all assigned testlets
- After the assessment, review the student performance and determine if you need to re-instruct and re-assess during this window
- Other EEs may be selected as additional assessments to align with district curriculum or student IEP goals

Teachers are required to use the State of Iowa Test Blueprints and maintain the test blueprint in the student's cumulative folder.

***Please note the DLM Blueprint does not include all of Iowa's ELA Essential Elements. Please refer to the Iowa Core English Language Arts Essential Elements document to ensure that students are receiving comprehensive literacy instruction.
